In 1998, MTI implemented a statewide engineered lighting study for 41 Michigan Police Posts and completed the project through 1999.

POST HISTORY



The Michigan Department of State Police began as a temporary, wartime emergency force for the purpose of domestic security during World War I. On April 19, 1917, Governor Albert Sleeper created the Michigan State Troops Permanent Force. With Colonel Roy C. Vandercook as the first commanding officer, this new force consisted of five Troops of mounted, dismounted and motorized units, totaling 300 men. On March 26, 1919, Public Act 26 reorganized the Constabulary as the permanent, peacetime Michigan State Police.

LIGHTING RECOMMENDATIONS...

FLUORESCENTS, INCANDESCENT AND EXIT FIXTURES:

The existing fluorescent and incandescent lighting fixtures in the Michigan State Police Posts vary. The lamp fixtures were either 1'x4' or 2'x4' that contained 34 watt, T-12 fluorescent lamps with magnetic ballasts. These fixtures were retrofitted with electronic ballasts and 32 watt, T-8 lamps. Incandescent fixtures were retrofitted with (CFL) compact fluorescent lamps. The exit signs were either retrofitted with LED technology or fixtures were replaced with new energy-efficient products. By retrofitting all fluorescent and incandescent lighting fixtures in these facilities, the State of Michigan will save **620,746 kWh** and nearly **\$50,074.90** per year.
